

### CBIC Recertification Overview

All certifications are valid for five years from the year of successful examination

Recertification takes place every five years

Recertification can be completed via infection prevention units (IPUs) or examination.



### Recertification by IPUs









### What is an IPU?

- IPU = Infection Prevention Unit (IPU) = continuing education credits
- Can be achieved by\*:
- Presenting at conferences,
- Authoring publications
- Attending local or national conferences,
- Participating in a professional organization in a position of leadership
- And more! IPU guide available online.



<sup>\*</sup>must be infection prevention related

### Recertification by IPUs


- Candidates must submit an IPU portfolio demonstrating completion of a minimum of 40 IPUs
- IPUs must be provided by a credible organization and at least 20/40 infection prevention units must be sponsored through an accredited organization or state licensing board.
- Candidates can accumulate IPUs any time after their previous recertification submission date throughout their five-year recertification period
- Candidates may access IPU portfolio once certified and must submit by October 31st of their expiration year.



### New! Recertification by IPUs

- To promote continuous learning, effective 2028, candidates must demonstrate that a portion of their IPUs have been attained in different years of the 5-year recertification cycle.
- Certificants who showcase leadership skills via participation in a formal mentorship program
  through a professional organization related to infection prevention and control may now earn 3
  IPUs per year of program participation.
- The CBIC Board *recommends* candidates earn at least two IPUs from DEI and Health Equity within healthcare as a part of the minimum required 40 IPUs. DEI and Health Equity should be self-evident in the title or learning objectives.



### Recertification by IPUs Timeline

Professional portfolio available once certified.

Record activities and upload verification documents

Submit portfolio by October 31<sup>st</sup>

CBIC reviews all portfolios

If successful, new five-year recertification period begins




### Recertification by IPUs: Helpful Hints

- Submit your IPUs as you earn them!
- Avoid late fees! Don't wait until the last minute to submit a portfolio. A 25% late fee is in place between November 1-November 30.
- Reach out to staff or your other IP colleagues with questions.
- Once your credits have been approved, you will receive a new 5-year certification and can begin submitting IPUs for your next portfolio, due in five years.



### IPUs and Chapter Activities Does my Chapter activity count towards IPUs?

- Subject matter related to infection prevention and control, and falls within at least one domain
- Able to verify chapter member attendance or participation by providing required documentation



### a-IPC<sup>TM</sup> Expiration Date & Number of IPUs required

12/31/2025 - 5 IPUs

12/31/2026 - 12 IPUs

12/31/2027 - 20 IPUs

12/31/2028 - 27 IPUs

12/31/2029 - 35 IPUs



### a-IPC<sup>TM</sup> Expiration Date & Number of IPUs required

- Certificants due to recertify in 2025 will not be required to meet a domain requirement but are encouraged to meet as many of the 6 domains as they can.
- Certificants due to recertify between the years of 2026-2029 will be granted a prorated required minimum domain amount since they were not given the full five-year term to earn their IPUs.
- The prorated IPU requirement for those with a certification expiration date between 2026-2029, will be to meet at minimum 4 out of 8 of the domains across their selected IPU activities.
